HISTORY OF FATHER'S DAY

Father's Day is a day set aside each year on the third Sunday in June. This year we will honor the father's on Sunday, June 18th. Many of us spend the day celebrating our fathers and the men in our lives, however we are not aware of the great lengths it took to initiate a national holiday.

Senora Louise Dodd of Spokane, Washington is the woman behind the driving force to provide a day to honor fathers. In 1909, Senora Louise Dodd was attending a church service in her hometown and listened to a church sermon on Mother's Day. She was inspired to push for a similar recognition for fathers. Her father, William Jackson Smart, was a Civil War Veteran, raised six children as a single parent.

On June 6, 1910, Dodd presented a petition with substantial support to the Spokane Ministerial Association and the local Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA). She initiated the first Father's Day on Sunday, June 19, 1910, with speeches by her pastor and surrounding churches.

Woodrow Wilson was the first president in 1916 to encourage the set aside day for fathers. However, this did not gain approval by the remaining congress. Dodd did not give up on her efforts. She took her mission on the road to gain momentum throughout the United States.

Father's Day was officially recognized as a federal holiday in 1972 with Nixon signing an official proclamation to declare the third Sunday of June as a day to honor father's permanently.



Cataracts are the leading cause of vision loss in America. Cataracts cause cloudy or yellowed vision. They can obstruct night vision and cause double vision. The cataract stops light from properly passing through to the retina.

Risk factors for cataracts include:

- Long-term UV exposure from the sun
- Inflammation in the eye
- Heredity
- Eye injuries/diseases
- Smoking

Cataracts are not only a Senior Citizen concern either. Although most signs and symptoms of cataracts don't show until at least age 40, cataracts can affect young adults and children on occasion.

Cataracts in a child can be present at time of birth or can develop after birth. Without proper treatment, children with cataracts could develop a poor visual pathway between their brain and their eyes, causing vision impairments.

There is no proven way to prevent cataracts from developing as we age. Luckily since they are so prevalent, they are easy to treat. The most common solution is

cataract surgery. The doctor will remove the clouded lens of the eye and replace it with an intraocular lens. The surgery typically takes 20 minutes and most people are able to return to their normal life in a short period of time.

National American Eagle Day - June 20

The Bald Eagle was selected as the U.S.A.'s National Symbol on the Great Seal by our country's Founding Fathers on June 20, 1782 by the Second Continental Congress.



The Seal is a symbol of our Independent

Nation and self-government. The eagle holds a scroll in its beak with the motto *E Pluribus Unum*, meaning "Out of Many, One" in Latin; in one claw an olive branch, a symbol of peace, and a bundle of arrows, a symbol of war, in the other. The number thirteen is repeatedly used on the seal to represent the 13 original colonies; 13 stars on the crest above the eagle, 13 stripes on the shield, 13 arrows, 13 olives and leaves and 13 letters in the motto.

For over 200 years now, the Bald Eagle has served as the pride of America's skies and the living symbol of all that we Americans stand for: Freedom, Courage, Strength, Spirit, and Excellence.



The Bald Eagle is deeply rooted in our nation's heritage, folklore and environment, and has special meaning to many Americans.
